2,310

students receiving Public Assistance were placed in enriching internship assignments. 265 low-income immigrants benefited from Adult Literacy instruction at 14 sites citywide.

## Senior Support Systems

### **Homecare**

372,332 hours of personal care, housekeeping, and/or shopping assistance to 819 functionally disabled elderly.

### **Transportation**

103,031 trips to 4,922 frail elderly, facilitating their access to essential medical and non-medical appointments and services.

### **Friendly Visiting**

5,345 visits to 399 homebound seniors.

### **Telephone Reassurance**

9,792 telephone calls to 616 isolated elderly.

### **Senior Citizen Centers**

Our five senior citizen centers provided an average of 1,013 congregate meals per day (253,460 total meals this year), in addition to a wide-range of case assistance, educational, recreational and healthy aging services.

### **Home Delivered Meals Program**

96,115 meals were delivered to homebound elderly.

### **Sunday Senior Center**

11,669 congregate meals and 6,124 home-delivered meals were served on 46 Sundays when area senior citizen centers are closed.

### **Case Assistance**

11,907 sessions of entitlement counseling, advocacy and emergency assistance services provided to 1,863 elderly.

### **Health Insurance Counseling Center**

844 hours of Health Insurance counseling and advocacy services provided to 213 clients.

### **Holocaust Survivor Support Systems**

423,176 units of services were provided to 2,263 Holocaust survivors. (Services include Homecare, Transportation, Case Assistance, Friendly Visiting, Drop in Center, Congregate & Home Delivered meals services.)

### **Cultural Immigrant Initiative Program**

293 cultural sessions were provided to 348 seniors.

## Vocational Support Systems

### **Career and Related Experience (CARE)**

2,310 students receiving Public Assistance were placed in enriching internship assignments as a pathway to financial independence.

### **Ladders for Leaders**

48 students received critical pre-employment training and participated in summer internships with some of the most dynamic corporations and businesses in NYC.

### **Employment and Training Program:**

103 low-income individuals were provided with occupational training/retraining in real estate, computer-related and medical-related fields, followed by employment counseling and job placement services.

### **Adult Literacy**

2,762 hours of ESL instruction were provided to 265 low-income, unemployed or under-employed limited English speaking students at 14 sites in low-income immigrant communities citywide.

### **Career Services Program**

163 low income Haredi individuals were assisted in their job search by the Parnossah Employment Services Program, and 570 career counseling sessions were provided to 427 individuals by The Crown Heights Career Assistance Program. 168 job placements were made.

### **Technical Assistance to Nonprofits**

#### **After School Program**

50 students from immigrant families in the Bukharian community of Queens benefitted from after school programming.

##### **After School Program**

85 public school students participated in after school programming at P.S. 101.

#### **Comprehensive Afterschool System of NYC Program**

186 students benefitted from after school programming at 2 sites in Brooklyn. 193 children benefitted from innovative summer camp programming.

Summer camp scholarships were provided to 69 needy children.

## Community Support Systems

### **Housing Preservation Initiative Program**

5 legal clinics, 8 tenant meetings, and 291 counseling sessions were provided to low-income residents of Coney Island.

### **"Operation HOOD" Cure Violence Program**

10 community events, 721 education materials distributed and 120 hours were spent canvassing in Coney Island, Brooklyn.

### **South Brooklyn Shuttle Bus**

11,791 units of transportation services to 1,071 south Brooklyn residents facilitating their access to essential employment, education, shopping, medical and non-medical appointments and services.
