Senior Center hosts outgoing public advocate

Government officials, community leaders and local residents packed the Surf Solomon Senior Center in Coney Island to pay tribute to Hon. Betsy Gotbaum, outgoing public advocate of New York City, for her eight years of service to New Yorkers in need of assistance with problems related to city government.
