## SENIOR SUPPORT SYSTEMS

### HOME CARE

Our homecare department provided 1,130,037 hours of personal care, housekeeping, laundry, and shopping assistance to 1,029 functionally disabled elderly.

### TRANSPORTATION

JCCGCI is NYC Department for the Aging's assigned older adult transportation provider in Brooklyn, with 75,899 units of transportation services provided to 3,078 frail elderly, enabling their access to medical and essential non-medical appointments and services.

### FRIENDLY VISITING

Our volunteers conducted 5,867 hours of phone and in-person visits to 283 homebound seniors, offering socialization and a link to the outside world.

### TELEPHONE REASSURANCE

JCCGCI social workers and staff offered human contact and support to 363 isolated older adults through 8,493 telephone calls.

### HOME DELIVERED MEALS

Our three Home Delivered Meals Programs provided 108,735 home delivered meals to 349 seniors.

### OLDER ADULT CENTERS

Our eight older adult centers provided 129,079 congregate meals, as well as a range of healthy aging, education, and recreational services to 4,679 seniors.

### CASE ASSISTANCE

JCCGCI staff provided 30,231 sessions of entitlement counseling, advocacy, and emergency assistance services to 3,620 elderly.

### HEALTH INSURANCE COUNSELING CENTER

Our Health Insurance Counseling Center conducted 1,520 hours of health insurance counseling and advocacy services benefiting 317 clients.



## MANAGEMENT SUPPORT

### TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO NONPROFITS

JCCGCI's Nonprofit HelpDesk conducted training sessions and one-on-one counseling for 1,115 nonprofit professionals citywide, assisting them in enhancing the efficiency and accountability of their operations.



## HOLOCAUST SURVIVOR SUPPORT

JCCGCI's extensive Holocaust Survivor Support Systems provided 1,213,676 units of service to 2,774 Holocaust survivors. Services include homecare, transportation, case assistance, friendly visiting, drop-in center, and congregate & home delivered meals.



## COMMUNITY SUPPORT

### HOUSING PRESERVATION INITIATIVE PROGRAM

Our staff provided 36 community outreach and/or free legal events for tenants in Coney Island. We also offered case management and advocacy for 50 individuals locally.

### OPERATION "HOOD" CURE VIOLENCE

60+ days without a shooting was achieved in Coney Island, Brooklyn. Operation HOOD Violence Interrupters mediated 99 conflicts successfully, and hosted 21 community events, including 6 shooting responses.



## EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT

### ADVANTAGE AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM

95 students from immigrant families benefitted from after school programming at a site in Queens.

### 21ST CENTURY COMMUNITY LEARNING CENTER

100 students benefitted from after school programming at a site in Queens.

### EXPANDED AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAM

85 public school students benefitted from this program at P.S.101.

### COMPREHENSIVE AFTER-SCHOOL SYSTEM OF NYC

184 students benefitted from after school programming at 2 sites in Brooklyn, and students participated in innovative summer camp programs.

### SUMMER CAMP SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Summer camp scholarships were provided to 89 needy children, ensuring they had access to summer programming.

### HORIZONS ACADEMY

2,011 hours of college and career preparation services were offered to prepare 125 at-risk students at Abraham Lincoln High School for successful adulthood, resulting in 100% of the students graduating high school.



## VOCATIONAL SUPPORT

### INTERNSHIP PLACEMENT SERVICES (IPS)

This service provided paid internships to 1,243 NYC Clean-Up Corps participants and developed 123 worksites citywide, many of which offered opportunities for growth and long-term positions.

### ADULT LITERACY

529 low-income, unemployed or under-employed limited English speaking students were provided with English language proficiency instruction and 336 made an educational gain.

### CAREER SERVICES PROGRAM

546 individuals from low income Jewish Ultra-Orthodox communities and other diverse populations were readied for better employment opportunities, resulting in 201 job placements, at primary service sites in the Borough Park, Williamsburg, Far Rockaway, Crown Heights and Gravesend communities through the Workforce Development Program. 283 Haredi individuals were assisted in their job search by the Parnossah Employment Services Program, with 265 career counseling sessions, 242 resume preparation assistance, and 90 job placements. 353 career counseling sessions, 106 job placements and 28 scholarships were provided to 257 individuals by The Crown Heights Career Assistance Program. The Crown Heights Career Hub enrolled 44 Crown Heights residents in business courses, leading to 18 internships, 9 students pursuing further education, and 19 individuals receiving job placement assistance.

### URBAN NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES

29,109 services sessions were provided at the UNS multi-service center in Coney Island.

### SEA GATE SHUTTLE BUS

3,760 units of transportation services were provided to 187 south Brooklyn residents, facilitating their access to essential employment, education, shopping, medical, and non-medical appointments and services.
